Superintendent Update

What a difference a year makes. After cursing Mother Nature for the relentless rain and heat stress in 2018, I now see how it was the best thing for the course. The brutal weather and water-logged soil wiped out a lot of the poa annua throughout the course. This made unsightly conditions for a while, but opened up the turf for newer varieties. The bentgrass overseeding in the fairways and tees has taken off. This in combination with the new aerator we bought back in 2018, and the drainage installed, is changing the course. The same idea was implemented into our rough areas as we overseeded with bluegrass. This turf will also continue to spread and fill over time.

As we enter the new year, I would like you to think about how you can help keep Emanon Country Club moving in the right direction. Maintaining and improving a golf course and grounds takes a lot of money and resources. In these competitive times, every little bit helps. Maybe bring a couple guests to show the new condition of your course. Let them experience a 3 1/2 to 4 1/2 hour round of golf, rather than 5 1/2 to 6 hours at many other courses. Mike was a former president at Fox Hill CC and passed away in 2016 while serving as president at Emanon CC. Mike championed many projects at both clubs and is missed by the membership at each, as is evident by the amount of interest this event has gained of the past few years.

This year's tournament started with Fox Hill hosting Saturday's round with 30 players from each club playing 2 different formats each day. How A Farm Became A Country Club

This is a dream come true story. It is about a group of good friends from Exeter who in the 1950's could not find a decent, uncrowded public course on which to enjoy golf. At that time golf was still something of an elitist's game played at private, white-collar country clubs. So, in 1956, these friends met and formed a club; dreaming of someday building their own golf course and vowing that their course would be an affordable blue-collar club.

A series of events played out that led to their dream coming true. On a 75-acre farm purchased with borrowed money (\$8,600.00), cultivated with their own labor and donated equipment, they started on the journey of building their dream course. Orchards were knocked down; grain fields cut, rock walls dismantled and the rocks used as beds for the greens. Woods were cleared, out buildings and barns torn down and the land graded. The biggest task was removing rocks from the future fairways. In 1959, the first nine holes were completed. Shortly thereafter, an additional 125 acres were purchased and in 1972 the final nine holes were finished.

Today, the Emanon Country Club is a beautiful semi-private 18-hole course complete with a watering system, modern club house and pro-shop.

The founders pondered over many names for their new club, but were unable to agree on any name and finally decided to call it the No Name Club. Someone noticed the No Name spelled backward was

“emanon” and so was born “Emanon Country Club.”
